- **38** –The number of continuing resolutions we have passed in the last 10 years.
- **8** – The number of omnibus spending bills we have enacted in the past 10 years.
- **1977** – The last and only time Congress passed a budget and enacted all its appropriations bills separately and on time.
- **1,208** –The number of unauthorized programs at the beginning of FY 2023.
- **2** – The number of years away we are from debt interest payments surpassing annual defense funding.
- **269,735** – The number of illegal migrant encounters at the southern border last month, which is a record.
- **110,000** – The record number of Americans killed by drug overdose in the last years.
- **\$33,626,943,979,485** – The always-increasing national debt.
- **17 percent** – Congress’s approval rating as of September 2023.

I understand that we cannot fix each of these overnight, but we will never fix any of them if we stick with business as usual.

House Republicans need a Speaker who has demonstrated leadership and success in and out of Congress. My 35 years of experience as a business leader makes me uniquely qualified to lead a diverse Republican Conference and ensure we break the pattern of legislating in a perpetual state of crisis.
